

60% of Maryland Students Do Not Read On Grade Level; Reading Experts Convene in Annapolis with Goal to Change Literacy Outcomes

WHO: Decoding Dyslexia Maryland (DD-MD) and Community Partners

WHY: Dyslexia and other language based learning differences affect up to 20% (1 in 5

students) in EVERY Maryland Classroom. Research shows that with a "Structured Literacy" approach to reading instruction, 95% of struggling readers will learn to read effectively. However, Maryland's classrooms do not OFTEN employ this approach and

too many children are falling through the cracks.
